INFORMATION ITEMS

Discussion – Virginia Department of Transportation's Secondary Six-Year Plan

Chairman Babyok welcomed VDOT and introduced Mr. Alan Saunders, Louisa Residency Engineer for the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT), to provide information in regards to the draft Secondary Six Year Plan (SSYP) for Louisa County.

Mr. Saunders highlighted the information in the FY2022 Louisa County SSYP work session package, which included:

- Projected allocations for the FY2021 SSYP;
- SSYP facts;
- Overview of the FY2021 SSYP;
- Listing of all secondary roads with traffic counts, as well as segregated tables that exhibited unpaved roads and roads with 50 or more vehicles per day spreadsheet;
- Listing of unpaved frontage roads;
- Federally qualifying secondary roads;
- VDOT recommendations for the SSYP update;
- Listing of construction program estimated allocations; and
- Previous projects included in the SSYP.

Mr. Saunders explained the projected allocations for FY2021-22 in the Secondary Six Year Plan for Louisa County and how those allocations can only be spent on unpaved roads with a minimum traffic count of 50 vehicles per day.

Louisa County has over 559 miles of secondary roads in the state system with about 531 miles paved. Louisa County has just over 28 miles of non-hard surfaced secondary roads with approximately 22 miles qualifying for hard surfacing. 5.73 miles of unpaved secondary roads are currently included in the Secondary Six Year Plan.

The following roads have been prioritized in the current Secondary Six-Year Plan:

- Route 617 - W Green Springs Roads: 0.95 miles
- Route 645 - Poplar Ave.: 0.80 Miles
- Route 698 - Rolling Path Road: 2.20 Miles (from Waltons Store Road to E. Old Mountain Road)
- Route 716 - Garland Town Road: 1.30 Miles (from Halls Store Road to Dead End)
- Route 735 - Colemans Lane: 0.46 Miles (from Fredericks Hall Road to Dead End)
- Route 1046 - Pine Ridge Dr.: 0.35 (from Dead End to Jefferson Highway)

Questions and comments were addressed by the Board regarding the proposed project allocation list; secondary roads with 50 or more vehicles per day; current projects included on the SSYP; and allocations to be spent on unpaved roads.
